The candidate will be required to submit (Upload) a copy of photo, signature, community and other certificates while submitting Online Application Form.

All the vacancies under limited recruitment will be filled with the local candidates of the respective zone only.

- 4) This recruitment is being made as per the provisions of the Andhra Pradesh State Prosecution Service Rules, 1992 issued by the Government of Andhra Pradesh in G.O.Ms.No.188 Home (Courts.C) Department, dated 30-03-1992 and the amendments thereon.
- 5) The quota earmarked for physically handicapped persons in the said rules shall, however, be filled in only by orthopedically handicapped persons whose speech, hearing, and sight are not impaired.
- 6) The recruitment is being made to the Posts of Assistant Public Prosecutors in Andhra Pradesh State Prosecution Service on a zonal basis and it is subject to the outcome of SLPs/WPs/OAs pending, if any.
- Relaxation in the upper age limit (as given in para 11 (b) and/or reservation to 'BC-E group' or 'any category in BC-E group') will be subject to the adjudication of the litigation pending before the Honourable Courts. However, relaxation in the upper age limit (as given in Para 11 (b) and/or reservation to 'BC-E group') is applicable to Sl.No. first to the fourteen categories of BC-E group as per the interim order on 25-03-2010 in Civil Appeal No(s).2628-2637 of 2010 of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. As per the G.O.Ms.No.23, Back Ward Class Welfare Dept., dt:07.07.2007, the castes mentioned in Sl.No.15 are treated as 'OC' category.
- 8) **Non-Creamy Layer:** Candidates belonging to Backward Classes shall submit the Community Certificate and Non-Creamy Layer Certificate to claim age relaxation and reservation. In case of failure to produce the Non-Creamy Layer Certificate on the day of verification of Certificates, the candidate's candidature will be considered under "Open Competition", if otherwise eligible, and the status cannot be changed later, at the candidate's will or choice, in any case.
 - a) The candidates belonging to Backward Classes (Non-Creamy Layer only) should submit the Community certificate in the format given in Annexure III to avail relaxation in age and reservation. The certificate must have been issued by the competent Revenue authority in terms of G.O.Ms.No.58 SW (J) Dept., dated 12-05-1997.
 - b) Only those candidates belonging to Backward Classes who do not belong to "Creamy layer" as defined in G.O.Ms.No.3, Backward Classes Welfare (C2) Department, dated 04-04-2006 will be eligible to avail age relaxation and reservation. They should submit the certificate in the format given in Annexure IV regarding exclusion from the Creamy Layer from the competent authority (Tahasildar) along with the Community certificate in the format given in Annexure III.
 - c) The Candidates of Backward Classes who belong to 'Creamy layer' cannot claim reservation and age relaxation.

- 9) **SC/ST Reservation:** The candidates belonging to Scheduled Tribes should submit the Community certificate issued by the competent authority of A.P. State. The candidates belongs to SC community should submit the latest community certificate based on the ordinance issued by the Government in A.P. Ordinance No.2 of 2025, dated 17.07.2025.
- 10) **WOMEN RESERVATION**: Under direct recruitment, 33 1/3 % of vacancies in each category, including EWS are reserved for women. The reservation will be **a horizontal on compartmental basis reservation** following principle of sufficiency i.e., the reservation of women candidates shall be adjusted proportionately in the respective category to which the women candidates belongs, in relaxation to relevant rules relating to Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, 1996. In the event of non-availability of eligible and suitable women candidates in a particular year, the vacancies reserved for them shall not be carried forward to the subsequent year and shall be filled up by men candidates of respective category. The horizontal on compartmental basis reservation will also be applicable to Person with Benchmark Disabilities and Ex-Servicemen.
- 11) The rule of special representation (reservation) i.e EWS, BC-A, BC-B, BC-C, BC-D, BC-E, SC-I, SC-II, SC-III, and ST as provided in Rule 22 of AP State & Subordinate Service Rules, 1996.
- 12) The requisite educational qualification, experience, age and procedure to be followed for selection are given below. The candidates must read the instructions given in this notification as well as "instructions for filling the application form" (issued along with the application form) carefully in their own interest.

13) Eligibility Conditions:

a) Age Limit:

i) A candidate must not have attained the age of 42 years as on 1st July, 2025 i.e., he/she must have been born not earlier than **2nd July**, **1983**.

b) The upper age limit prescribed in Para(a) above will be relaxable as under:

- i) Upto a maximum of 5 (five) years, if a candidate belongs to a Backward Class (Non-Creamy Layer only) or a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe;
- ii) Upto a maximum of ten years if a candidate is Orthopedically Handicapped person;
- iii) Length of regular service limited upto a maximum of 5 (five) years if a candidate is an employee of A.P. State Government. Employees of APTRANSCO, DISCOMS, APGENCO, Corporations, Muncipalities, Local bodies etc. are not entitled for age relaxation. Service certificate has to be submitted by eligible candidates claiming age relaxation.
- iv) 3 (three) years in addition to the length of service rendered in the Army, Naval or Air Force of the Union for the candidates who served in the Army, Naval or Air Force of the *Union*.

Note: Persons serving in the Armed Forces of the Union, who on retirement from Service, would come under the category of Ex-Servicemen, may be permitted to apply for re-employment one year before the completion of the specified terms of engagement and avail themselves of all concessions available to Ex-Servicemen but shall not be permitted to leave the uniform until they completed the Specified Term of Engagement in the Armed Forces of the Union.

- v) 3 (three) years in addition to the length of service rendered as a whole time Cadet Corps Instructor in NCC provided the candidate rendered a minimum service of 6 months as a whole time Cadet Corps Instructor in NCC.
- vi) Upto a maximum of 3 (three) years if a candidate is a retrenched temporary employee in the State Census Department with a minimum service of 6 months during 1991.

Save as provided above, the age limits prescribed can in no case be relaxed.

NOTE: The date of birth accepted by the SLPRB is that entered in the **Secondary School Certificate or Matriculation or an equivalent examination certificate**. No other document relating to age like horoscopes, affidavits, birth extracts from Municipal Corporation, service records and the like will be accepted.

c) Minimum Educational Qualification: The candidate must possess a Bachelor's degree in any subject along with a Bachelor's Degree in Law awarded by any University in India, established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, Provincial Act or a State Act or of any Institution recognised by the University Grants Commission or any other equivalent qualification. The candidates who have passed five year course in law after Intermediate are also eligible.

d) Experience:

i) The candidate must have practised as an advocate for not less than three (3) years active practice in Criminal Courts in the State as on the date of notification i.e., <u>04-08-2025</u>

Note: As per sub-section 9 of Section 18 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023, the period during which a person has been in practice as a Pleader or has rendered (whether before or after the commencement of this Code) service as a Public Prosecutor or Asst. Public Prosecutor or other Prosecuting Officer, by whatever name called, shall be deemed to be the period during which such person has been in practice as an advocate.

e) Medical Standards:

- i) The candidate should possess sound health and be free from any bodily defect or infirmity which will render him unfit for service.
- ii) Candidates whose speech or hearing or sight is impaired, are not eligible for service.

14) Fee Structure

a) Candidates with local candidature of Andhra Pradesh belonging to OCs and BCs applying for the Post have to pay a fee of **Rs.600/-** towards processing of application, written examinations etc. Local candidates of Andhra Pradesh belonging to SCs and STs have to pay only **Rs.300/-** and all other candidates have to pay **Rs.600/-**.

b) Mode of Payment of Fee:

Step-1: Candidate has to visit SLPRB Website www.slprb.ap.gov.in to pay prescribed Registration Fee by providing his / her Basic personal details like Name, Father's Name, Date of Birth, Mobile Number, Community and SSC Hall Ticket Number or its equivalent through Credit Card, Debit Card, Net Banking or any other mode made available on the SLPRB Website.

Step-II: After making Payment, the candidate has to visit the website www.slprb.ap.gov.in to submit the Online Application Form. Even after making payment of fee, if the candidate fails to press 'submit' the Online Application Form, such cases shall be rejected without giving any notice and fee once paid will not be refunded in any case.

- 15) **LAST DATE FOR RECEIPT OF APPLICATIONS:** Applications submitted after 1700 hrs on 07-09-2025 will not be accepted. Incomplete applications will not be entertained.
- 16) Incomplete applications or applications without prescribed enclosures also will not be entertained.

17) CANDIDATES SHOULD ENSURE THEIR ELIGIBILITY FOR THE EXAMINATION:

The candidates applying for the examination should ensure that they fulfill all eligibility conditions for admission to the examination. Their admission at all stages of the examination will be purely provisional and subject to satisfying the prescribed eligibility conditions.

The board will take up verification of eligibility conditions with reference to original documents only after the candidate is finally qualified.

The registered candidates may download their Hall Ticket from the website, (07) days before the date of Written Test.

18) **Selection Procedure/Scheme:** The Selection Procedure/Scheme of the Exam will be as follows:

A) Written Examination:

Candidates will be required to appear for a written examination in two papers (each of three hours duration). Both papers will be set in English language only. The syllabus is given in Annexure-I. The date of written examination is proposed to be held on **05.10.2025** (Sunday) Paper-I from 10.00 AM to 01.00 PM and Paper-II from 02.30 PM to 05.30 PM on the same day.

Note: i) Paper-I will be objective in nature containing 200 questions.

- ii) Paper-II will be descriptive in nature. The candidates have to answer the questions using blue / black pen in the question-cum-answer booklet which will be supplied by SLPRB.
- iii) The minimum marks to be secured by the candidates in order to qualify in the written examination is 40% for OCs; 35% for BCs; and 30% for SCs/STs/Ex-Servicemen in each paper. If a candidate fails to secure qualifying marks even in one paper, he will be disqualified.
- iv) The persons with benchmark disabilities should secure minimum qualifying marks as per their respective communal categories.

Candidates have to answer the questions on an OMR answer sheet using <u>Blue</u> <u>/Black Ball Point pen</u> only. For this purpose, candidates should bring Blue/Black Ball Point pens along with them.

Intimation Letter: The candidate who qualifies in the Written Test will be informed the date of Interview through the website **www.slprb.ap.gov.in.** Candidates should bring the Intimation Letter when they come to attend the Interview.

B) Interview:

i) The candidates shall be called for interview in the ratio of 1:2 with reference to the number of vacancies based on their marks in written examination out of 400 (200 in paper-I and 200 in paper-II) duly following the special representation as laid down in Rule-22 and sub rule 2 of Rule 22-A of Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules and as per para 4 above. **Interview will carry a maximum of 25 marks**.

When two or more candidates in a particular category obtain equal marks, preference will be given to the candidate who was born earlier.

Note: If he/she does not attend for interview, his/her case will not be considered for final selection.

C) Selection:

The final selection will be strictly on relative merit of the candidates in each category, obtained by them based on their total score in the written examination in papers-I and II (400 marks) and interview (25 marks) duly following the special representation as laid down in Rule 22 and sub rule 2 of Rule 22-A of Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules and as per para 4 above. As per G.O.Ms.No.124 General Administration (SPF.A) Dept., dated 07-03-2002 while filling up the vacancies, the first 30% of posts should be filled following combined merit list of locals and non-locals and thereafter, the remaining 70% of the posts shall be filled up by locals only.

When two or more candidates in a particular category obtain equal marks, preference will be given to the candidate who was born earlier.

19) **Reservation to local candidates:** Reservation to local candidates is applicable as provided in the Rules and as amended from time to time as in force on the date of notification. The candidates claiming reservation as local candidates should enclose the required Study certificates (from VII class to X class (or) from IV class to X class, in case he/she has not studied from VII class to X class in one particular district). Residence Certificate in the proforma only should be enclosed for those candidates who have not studied in any Educational Institutions.

Any person who is Non-Local to AP, their community will be treated as OC, they cannot claim age relaxation and reservation.

Note: The Government of India have issued following Gazette Notification on 09.06.2016 vide No. 404.

- **G.S.R. 1350 (E):** In exercise of the powers conferred by clauses (1) and (2) of article 371 D of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following Order further to amend the Andhra Pradesh Public Employment (Organisation of Local Cadres and Regulation of Direct Recruitment) Orders, 1975, namely:—
- 1. i) This order may be called the Andhra Pradesh Public Employment (Organisation of Local Cadres and Regulation of Direct Recruitment) Amendment Order, 2016.
 - ii) It shall come into force at once.
- 2. In the Andhra Pradesh Public Employment (Organisation of Local Cadres and Regulation of Direct Recruitment) Order, 1975, in paragraph 7, after subparagraph (2) and before the Explanation, the following sub-paragraph shall be inserted, namely:—

- "(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-paragraph (1) or (2), candidates who migrate to any part of the State of Andhra Pradesh from the State of Telangana within a period of ten years from the 2nd day of June, 2014 shall be regarded as the local candidate in the State of Andhra Pradesh at the place of his residence and be treated on par with the local candidates residing in that area, in accordance with such guidelines as may be issued by the Government of Andhra Pradesh for the purpose of employment."
- 3. Modalities for the same are under consideration with Government of Andhra Pradesh vide Circular Memo. No. 4136/SPF & MC/2015-5, dt: 08.08.2016.Candidates who are covered by this order will be required to submit necessary certificate as per the instructions given by the Government of Andhra Pradesh.

Definition of local candidate:

- (i) "Local Candidate" means a candidate for direct recruitment to any post in relation to that Local area where he/she has studied in Educational Institution(s) for not less than four consecutive academic years prior to and including the year in which he/she appeared for SSC or its equivalent examination. If however, he/she has not studied in any educational institution during the above four years period, it is enough if he/she has resided in that area which is claimed as his/her local area during the above said period.
- (ii) In case the candidate does not fall within the scope of the above, it will be considered if he/she has studied for a period of not less than seven years prior to) and inclusive of the year in which he/she has studied for the maximum period out of the said period of seven years and where the period of his/her study in two or more local areas are equal such local area where he/she has studied last (in such local area) will be taken for determining the local candidature. Similarly, if he/she has not studied during the above said period in any Educational Institution(s) the place of residence during the above period will be taken into consideration and local candidature determined with the reference to the maximum period of residence or in the case of equal period where he/she has resided last.
- (iii) If the claim for local candidature is based on study, the candidate is required to produce a certificate from the Educational Institution (s) where he/she has studied during the said 4 years period i.e., from VII class to X class (or) 7 years period i.e., from IV class to X class, in case he/she is not studied from VII class to X class in one particular district in Annexure-IV(A). If, however, it is based on residence, a certificate should be submitted as prescribed in Annexure-IV (B) obtained from an officer of the Revenue Department not below the rank of a Mandal Revenue Officer in independent charge of a Mandal.
- (iv) If, however, a candidate has resided in more than one Mandal during the relevant four/seven year's period but within the same District, separate

certificates from the Mandal Revenue Officers exercising jurisdiction have to be obtained in respect of different areas.

Note:

- a) Single certificate, whether of study or residence would suffice for enabling the candidate to apply as a "Local Candidate"
- b) Residence certificate will not be accepted, if a candidate has studied in any educational institution upto SSC or equivalent examination. Such candidates have to produce study certificates only invariably. The candidates, who acquired Degree from Open Universities without studying SSC/Matriculation or equivalent in educational institutions, have to submit residence certificate only.
- c) The Zones comprise the districts/area mentioned against each as given below:

- 20) Board will take finger prints of both left and right thumb of the candidates and photo at the time of attending written examination for each paper and at the time of attending interview.
- 21) Recruitment to the posts shall be made as per the provisions of "The Andhra Pradesh Public Employment (Organisation of Local cadres and regulation of direct recruitment) Order, 1975" and further amendments thereon. The Andhra Pradesh Public Employment (Organisation of Local Cadres and Regulation of Direct Recruitment) Order, 1975 will apply to the special categories also.
- 22) Candidates who claim reservation as Ex-Servicemen should satisfy the conditions mentioned in Rule 2 (16) of A.P. State and Subordinate Service Rules and having the necessary certificate from the competent authority.
- 23) The selection of the candidates will be provisional and subject to verification of the original certificates, antecedents and medical fitness.
- 24) Mere admission to any test or inclusion of a Candidate's name in a Merit List shall not confer on him/her any right for selection / appointment to such service, class or category. The provisional selection of the Candidates to the Posts mentioned in this Notification is subject to several other requirements described.
- 25) **Antecedents verification**: No person shall be eligible for appointment to any service by direct recruitment unless he satisfies the selection authority as well as the appointing authority that his character and antecedents are such as to qualify him for such service.

- 26) **Disqualification for appointment**: The candidates falling under the following categories shall be disqualified for selection under these rules:-
 - (i) If any document produced by the candidate is fake of forged as established during antecedent verification.
 - (ii) If the candidate does not reveal the facts in the applications form about Criminal cases.
 - (iii) If the candidate himself or through his relatives or friends or any other has canvassed or endeavoured to enlist extraneous support whether from official or non-official sources for his candidature.
 - (iv) A person (a) who has entered into or contracted a marriage with a person having a spouse living, or (b) who, having a spouse living, has entered into or contracted a marriage with any other person. Provided that the State Government may, if satisfied that such marriage is permissible under the personal law applicable to such person, any person from the operation of this rule.
 - (v) A person who has been dismissed from the service of a State or Central Government or from the service of any Central or State Government undertaking or local body or other authority.
 - (vi) A person who has been convicted for any offence or facing trial in any court of law, except for offences of technical nature like Motor Vehicles Act Violations, J.J. Act (Juvenile Justice) Violations, shall stand disqualified.
 - (vii) A person who is involved in an offence involving moral turpitude is disqualification for appointment.
- 27) In the event of any information being found false or incorrect or ineligibility being detected at any time even after appointment, he / she will be discharged from service forthwith by the appointing authority without giving any notice.
- 28) Scale of Pay: Assistant Public prosecutor: Rs. 57100-147760 (RPS.2022)
- 29) The Contributory Pension Scheme will applicable.

30) Check List

- a) The candidates are requested to check their eligibility carefully and fill in all the relevant columns in the application form.
- b) Copies of the following documents must be enclosed in support of the information given in the application form where necessary. Failure to enclose the same will lead to rejection of the application form.
 - Secondary School/Matriculation certificate or equivalent certificate in support of the date of birth.

- ii) Educational Qualification.
- iii) Certificate issued by the Bar Council of the State of Andhra Pradesh/any State or Bar Council of India regarding enrolment as Advocate.
- (iv) Certificate(s) of active practice not less than three (3) years as on date of notification in Criminal Courts in the State of A.P. issued by the Local Bar Association(s) / Presiding Officers of the Concerned Court(s) where he practised.
- v) Study certificate issued by the school authorities or Residence certificate issued by M.R.O. (Annexure II(A) or Annexure II (B))
- vi) Community/Caste Certificate for BCs: The Non-Creamy layer candidates who wish to claim concession in age and also reservation specified for the Backward Classes should submit the Community Certificate in the format given in Annexure -III and also Non-Creamy layer certificate in Annexure-IV and the certificate(s) must have been issued by the competent Revenue authority.
- vii) Community/Caste Certificate for SCs/STs: Community/Caste Certificate in the format given in Annexure III, if the candidate claims reservation and/or age concession as SC or ST and the certificate must have been issued by the competent Revenue authority.
- viii) Certificate from the Superintendent, Government General Hospital /Superintendent of District Headquarters Hospital in respect of orthopedically handicapped persons if the candidate claims reservation and/or age concession Annexure -V.
- (viii) Certificate from the competent authority in respect of State Government employees/those who worked in the Army, Naval or Air Force of the Union/ NCC Instructors retrenched temporary employee in the State Census Department claiming age concession.
- 31) The SLPRB, A.P. reserves the right to take decision regarding conduct of examination and selecting candidates as per rules. The decision of the SLPRB, A.P. shall be final in all respects. Further, SLPRB, A.P. may modify and reschedule the Examination/Test due to unforeseen circumstances. All efforts will be made to intimate any such change to the candidates. However, candidates are also requested to regularly visit the website and see notifications issued through Newspapers, TV and other media.
